


## Gender baseline survey [1]

Gender is an important determinant of inequality in access to and control over societal resources and benefits. The objective of the Kenya National Gender Policy is to ensure women?s empowerment and mainstreaming of needs of women, men, girls and boys in all sectors of development in the country so that they can participate and benefit equally from development initiatives. On the other hand, IFAD Gender policy states that

development programmes are more relevant and sustainable if both women and men are able to participate and express their own needs and priorities in decision making forums.
